Praise the Lord, and welcome back to Part 2 of: ***You Are Important!***

Hopefully you have read **1 Samuel Chapters 29 and 30**. I mentioned last month that you are important to the mission and goals of the church when you stay on your post, watching and praying.

However, there will come a time when others will have to leave you behind with the supplies. Leave you behind to care for the church. Leave you in the rear so you can support others at the front. It doesn't mean that you are not important. It simply means that you started out but couldn't make it to the fight, whatever the reason. Therefore, you have to be used in another capacity — one that is important to the mission.

And so when the company of Amalekites was overtaken and defeated and everything recovered, David and his men returned back to the brook of Besor. And the 200 men who were left behind went out to meet David and the people who were with him. The Bible tells us that David saluted them upon his arrival. He didn't frown on them. He didn't scorn them. He didn't reprimand them. He didn't look down on them. But he took the time to salute them. Why? It's because they were important. Would you have done the same? Let's check the reaction of David's men who returned with him.

In **Verse 22** we read: *“Then answered all the wicked men and men of Belial, of those that went with David, and said, Because they went not with us, we will not give them ought of the spoil that we have recovered, save to every man his wife and his children, that they may lead them away, and depart.”* No matter where you turn, there are always some evil, greedy folks who don't think much of others or

willing to share with them. You know anyone like this? Belial means worthlessness, worthless, good for nothing, unprofitable, bottom-out folks. And David had some evil, no-accounts riding with him. They were men who only cared for themselves. They are the kind who says that if you are not there at the fight, then you are out of luck. It doesn't matter how hard you have worked or how far you have managed to come. You just don't get anything! What a selfish attitude!

But listen to Commander David's response in **Verse 23**: *“Then said David, Ye shall not do so, my brethren, with that which the LORD hath given us, who hath preserved us, and delivered the company that came against us into our hand.”* Listen! You didn't do it on your own. In fact, I can hear David saying you had better be glad that I inquired of the Lord. For it was the Lord who restored us! It was God who empowered us to take back what the enemy took from us!

David goes on to say in **Verse 24**: *“For who will hearken unto you in this matter? But as his part is that goeth down to the battle, so shall his part be that tarrieth by the stuff: they shall part alike.”* In other words, they are just as important as you are. They were with us from day one. They rode with us, fought with us, lived with us, and helped protected our families and our possessions. They are as much a part of this as you are. Whether at the front or in the rear, they are still important! They did not desert! They did not resign. They did not quit. Therefore, they deserve their share! What a declaration! Have You Considered My Servant?

Job 1:8 (NKJV)

“Then the Lord said to Satan, “Have you considered My servant Job, that there is none like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man, one who fears God and shuns evil?”

Have you ever stopped and wondered why we go through the things we face in life? At times we say to ourselves, *“I am doing everything right—so why am I still experiencing so much pain and affliction?”* Meanwhile, we look around and see others who seem “undeserving” receiving blessing after blessing, while we encounter trial after trial.

In those moments, we cry out to God: *“Why so much pain? Why so much hardship? Why are You not helping me out of these muddy waters I feel myself sinking deeper into?”*

But have you ever considered that God, in His sovereignty, may allow Satan temporary permission to test us? These tests are not designed to destroy us, but to reveal the depth of our faith. Do we trust God only when life is good and the blessings flow? Or do we remain faithful when all we see is suffering?

Consider Job. The Bible describes him as an upright man who feared and loved God. Yet Job was tested in ways that few of us could imagine. He lost his wealth, his health, and even his children. He questioned, he grieved, and he wrestled with the weight of it all—but Job never abandoned his faith. He did not curse God, nor did he let go of his trust that God had a greater purpose, even in the midst of his pain.

Our trials serve the same purpose today. They press us to examine the foundation of our faith. Are we only faithful when life is easy, or do we cling to God when everything else is stripped away?

Like Job, will we remain steadfast, refusing to give in to the schemes of the enemy? Or will we allow temporary hardship to pull us away from the One who holds our future?

Let us be a people who endure with unwavering faith, trusting that even in our darkest seasons, God is still at work—refining, strengthening, and preparing us for greater things.

Focus on the Marriage & Family – *Choices Have Consequences (B) (Part 13)*

Bottom line...our choices matter! The choices we make as children, and even more so as adults, have a significant impact, both positive and negative, in the short and long term. As I look back over my life and think things over (all the singers recognize that phrase...Lol), I can truly say that the best choice I ever made was to make Jesus my Lord and Savior. My wife was the second best choice, in case you are wondering.

In **Joshua 24:15**, Joshua gives a charge: “**Choose ye this day whom you will serve...as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.**” Serving the Lord or Satan is a choice. Doing right or wrong is a choice. Holding your peace or giving someone a piece of your mind is a choice. For my young readers, “giving someone a piece of your mind” basically means to speak angrily to someone about something they did or said that upset you. Even if you are saved, you must choose each day to serve the Lord. God is not a bully who makes you stay when you want to leave. That would be a form of human trafficking.

Poor relationships and poor family dynamics could be due to misfortune or the outcome of a series of poor decisions. As our society becomes more liberal and churches become more open to alternatives, we are in for the biggest fight for morality and holiness that mankind has ever experienced. Case in point, the term we used to refer to a man and woman living together without being married to each other was “shacking.” Young couples today refer to it as a trial run. In an attempt not to hurt the couple’s feelings, the church chooses to exercise more tolerance by remaining silent with the expectation that they will get it together in due time. I wonder how that is working out. The truth is often hard to handle. Tough love is often more difficult to dispense, but it is still necessary. Biblical standards are still in order. I encourage every “born again” Christian soldier to stand for holiness. “**But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life.**” (**Romans 6:22**).

When I see homeless people, I can’t help but wonder how they ended up in that condition. Where is their family? Where are their friends? Is their current status a function of poor decisions, or did life just take an unfortunate turn? No matter the reason, decisions made by someone led to this unfortunate outcome. The same is true for finances.

There was a period of time when it seemed as though I had a hole in my pocket. Money came and evaporated so fast, it felt like a curse. The truth was, we didn’t exercise good financial principles. Finally, when we were six figures in debt, we “made a choice” to take deliberate steps to reverse our financial situation using the Dave Ramsey financial makeover approach. It worked! Dave Ramsey contends, “Your financial situation is the result of your behavior.” To solve a problem, you must first admit there is a problem. Then ask God for help and wisdom. It is also a good idea to do some research. “**Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved (worthy).**” (**2 Timothy 2:5 NIV**). Knowledge is not power. It is powerful and puts you in a position to make better decisions.

Next month, I’ll talk about the benefits of making good choices. Until then, remember, “Your future is not ahead of you, it’s inside of you. You make your future by the choices you make today.” — Myles Munroe

The Doctrine of God

Greetings, everyone!

I remember as a child, my mother would play this song by James Cleveland called “God is” on the record player. I would stop what I was doing to quietly listen to the singers’ voices and the lyrics. The song highlights God’s character and abilities. As I got older and experienced life, I gained a deeper understanding of who “God is,” and I would like to share it with you. This month, we will learn the doctrine of God.

To understand the doctrine of God, we need to know who He is. God is a spirit (**John 4:24**). God is holy (**Leviticus 19:2**). God is good (**Psalms 34:8**). God is our Lord and our rock (**Psalms 18:31**). God is love (**1 John 4:8**). He is a true, living God (**Jeremiah 10:10**). He is God (**1 Kings 18:39**). God’s presence is not only within the church but also in everyday life, connecting with us through daily experiences. It is believed that God is described as a relational being, depicted as personal and engaging in relationships and actions. In this view, God is characterized as relational and living. God has immanent attributes, which means that God is present within and involved in the world and creation, rather than being distant or separate from it. God is very much involved in your life, according to **Jeremiah 29:11**. God is self-sufficient, non-dependent, and uncreated. There is one character that some may not like to discuss is God’s jealousy.

God instructed Moses, **“For you shall worship no other god, for the Lord, whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God.” Exodus 34:14 (ESV)**. God’s jealousy can never be compared to humans’ jealousy. Jealousy among humans can lead to unethical actions or wrongdoing. The concept of divine jealousy refers to God’s rightful claim to be praised and worshiped as the creator, emphasizing an expectation for individuals to honor Him accordingly. God understands that this world is wicked, and His doctrine is being manipulated and omitted. However, He is actively influencing the natural order through extraordinary means. His perspective encompasses a broader scope, much like an overview from a mountain top, compared to our more limited viewpoint from the valleys. **“The eyes of the Lord are in every place, keeping watch on the evil and the good.” Proverbs 15:3 (ESV)**. God is always ready to fight for His children. God is a warrior!

Isaiah portrayed God as a warrior: **“He saw that there was no man and wondered that there was no one to intercede; then his own arm brought him salvation, and his righteousness upheld him. He put on righteousness as a breastplate, and a helmet of salvation on his head; he put on garments of vengeance for clothing and wrapped himself in zeal as a cloak.” Isaiah 59:16-17 (ESV)**. God has many names to describe who He is to us. But there is one that stands out the most, I AM.

In **Exodus 3:14 (ESV)**, God tells Moses who He is and to share it with the Israelites, **“I am who I am.”** And he said, **“Say this to the people of Israel: ‘I AM has sent me to you.’** I AM means the one who is the self-existent one, eternal and unchanging. Remember, Saints, God is our heavenly Father who loves us. Next month, I will discuss Christology.






