“Then answered all the wicked men and men of Belial, of those that went with David, and said, Because they went not with us, we will not give them ought of the spoil that we have recovered, save to every man his wife and his children, that they may lead them away, and depart.” 1 Samuel 30:22.

Praise the Lord, and welcome to Part 3 of: *You Are Important!*

After David issued his declaration in **1 Samuel 30:22, Verse 25** makes us to know: **“And it was so from that day forward, that he made it a statute and an ordinance for Israel unto this day.”** As I mentioned in Part I, there are some similarities between David’s statute and what is true with regards to our service as Christians today. Allow me to highlight some of them for you.

Let’s begin with the fact that God’s army requires two forms of service. Any military venture or undertaking is dependent on support forces and battle forces. And we need to know that we are soldiers in God’s army. Paul wrote in **2 Timothy 2:3-4** and said: **“Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier.”**

You are important and God has chosen you to be a soldier, a companion of the cause of Christ. Whether you are fighting at the front or in the rear with the staff, you are still important to the success of the mission. You get the same pay or reward as those fighting at the front, providing you are still serving faithfully. Hear this: Much military planning revolves around how to support those at “the front.”

Logistical support comes from the rear. Therefore, someone must be in the back pushing support to the front. And you can best believe that all of us weren’t cut out to be at the front. God didn’t call all of us to be at the front. In fact, the Word declares that **“He gave some Apostles, and some prophets, and some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ.”** Neverthe-

less, we have all been called to serve. And that, my friend, is what makes you important!

However, some of us have been left behind with the staff for so long that we feel forgotten. We are yet serving but we aren’t getting our share. We aren’t getting any of the spoil. We aren’t getting any recognition. We aren’t getting any thanks. I write to tell you, my friend, that you are still important and that your day is coming! If you just stay in the army of the Lord and continue to faithfully do what is required and asked of you, then you will get your reward!

Listen! Two things military leaders learned long ago: 1) Men won’t fight on an empty stomach, and 2) Men won’t march without shoes. Many battles have been won by the efficiency of the support forces in keeping up with those on the front. This was one reason why Eisenhower was such a great general; he was a logistical genius. He knew that support must come from the rear.

The same is true with God’s army and the battles we face. We need both front-line fighters and guardians of the staff. There are spiritual leaders and those who support them. Pastors need support. Evangelists need support. Ministers need support. Choir directors and praise team leaders need support. Ushers need support. Everybody is important! And when you see a successful program, it’s only because great support was provided from the rear! And that’s the truth!

Your Idols Won't Save You

1 Kings 18:23-24 (NKJV)

“Therefore let them give us two bulls; and let them choose one bull for themselves, cut it in pieces, and lay it on the wood, but put no fire under it; and I will prepare the other bull, and lay it on the wood, but put no fire under it. (24) Then you call on the name of your gods, and I will call on the name of the Lord; and the God who answers by fire, He is God.” So all the people answered and said, “It is well spoken.”

ACTIVE VISUAL

Here is Elijah speaking to the children of Israel on Mount Carmel asking them how much longer will they falter between serving two masters. If the Lord God is your God, then follow Him. If Baal is your god, then follow him. There is no in between.

THE SOLUTION

Elijah, the prophet, presents the solution to the people to determine who is the one true God. The people and Elijah would each take a bull, two total, and cut it into pieces and lay it on the wood but put no fire under it. The people would call on their gods. Elijah would call on the Lord God. The God who answers by fire would be the one true God.

THE OUTCOME

Elijah was so gracious that he let the people go first because it was so many of them. The people prepared the bull as agreed upon and began to call on Baal. There was no answer. They began to leap around the around the altar but there still was no answer. They continued to call on Baal from morning to noon. Elijah began to mocked them and told them cry out louder; maybe Baal is mediating or sleeping. The people did as such but there was still no answer. Evening came and there was still no answer from Baal.

ELIJAH'S PREPARATION OF THE ALTAR — 1 Kings 18:31-37 (NKJV)

“And Elijah took twelve stones, according to the number of the tribes of the sons of Jacob, to whom the word of the Lord had come, saying, “Israel shall be your name. (32) Then with the stones he built an altar in the name of the Lord; and he made a trench around the altar large enough to hold two seahs of seed. (33) And he put the wood in order, cut the bull in pieces, and laid it on the wood, and said, Fill four waterpots with water, and pour it on the burnt sacrifice and on the wood. (34) Then he said, Do it a second time, and they did it a second time; and he said, Do it a third time, and they did it a third time. (35) So the water ran all around the altar; and he also filled the trench with water. (36) And it came to pass, at the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice, that Elijah the prophet came near and said, Lord God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, let it be known this day that You are God in Israel and I am Your servant, and that I have done all these things at Your word. (37) Hear me, O Lord, hear me, that this people may know that You are the Lord God, and that You have turned their hearts back to You again.”

As a result, the fire of the Lord fell and consumed the sacrifice. The people fell on their faces and recognized who was the one true God.

What idols do you need to destroy that have taken the place of God? It is time to come back to worship the one true Living God this day!!!

Christology Part I

Greetings, everyone!

During my formative years at the Temple of Christ Church, I was introduced to the teachings of Christ. First Lady Sister Fannie Barreau provided foundational instruction in Primary Sunday School, particularly during what is now referred to as Resurrection Sunday. She assigned memorable statements about Christ to my brothers, Briscoe and Tom, as well as to myself. My sentence was, “Jesus Christ arose on Easter Day.” This phrase became part of my dinner prayer, a tradition I continue to observe.

I remain grateful to the Temple of Christ Church for this enduring influence. This statement provides significant insight into Christ and His nature. We know that He is the Son of the living God and was born from a virgin. However, there is so much about Christ that we may have overlooked. Welcome to Christology!

Christology refers to the exploration of the life and activities of Christ. The New Testament is the primary source for Christology. Christ is known for His titles: Messiah (**John 4:25-26**), Lord and Savior (**2 Peter 3:18**), Son of Man (**Mark 14:62**), the Great High Priest (**Hebrews 4:14**), the (sacrificial) Lamb of God (**John 1:36**), the eternal, pre-existent Word (**John 1:1**), and the Alpha and Omega (**Revelation 22:13**).

“Christ” is not a surname but a title, derived from the Greek word *Christos*, which translates the Hebrew *Mashiah* (“Messiah”), meaning “anointed one.” While prophets and priests in ancient Israel were anointed, the term mostly referred to kings. The full significance of “Christ” is rooted in Old Testament expectations of God’s Messiah.

The phrase “Jesus Christ is Lord” (**Romans 10:9**) was among the earliest Christian statements of faith, distinguishing believers from non-believers. The title “Lord,” derived from Greek *Kyrios* and Aramaic *mar*, carried strong theological meaning due to its role in translating the Hebrew “YHWH,” the sacred name for God.

Many Christians see “Son of Man” as a natural balance to “Son of God.” While “Son of God” highlights Christ’s divinity, “Son of Man” affirms His humanity. Paul describes both Jesus and believers as “Son of God,” but makes a distinction: believers are considered God’s children through adoption, while Jesus is uniquely God’s own Son, as stated in **Romans 8:32**.

Jesus is recognized in Christianity as saving people from their sins (**Matthew 1:21**) and acting with divine authority, a role reserved for God in Judaism. Early Christians used the fish symbol—spelled “*Ichthys*” in Greek—as an acronym for “Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior.”

Christ is regarded as the one who carries the Holy Spirit. During His time on earth, Jesus was recognized as the person on whom God’s Spirit resided. The event where Jesus received the Spirit during His baptism is especially significant for this reason (**Matthews 3:13-17**).

Next month, we’ll discover even more aspects of Christ — some familiar, others new. Let’s keep exploring Christology together.

Focus on the Marriage & Family – *Choices Have Consequences (C)* (Part 14)

In the past two articles, I focused primarily on the consequences of making poor or unwise decisions. In this article, I will focus more attention on the consequences of making “good” decisions. Warning...making good or wise decisions is not always simple and often requires work. Lazy people don't tend to make good decisions. Not just lazy in their actions, but lazy in their thinking as well, because the two go hand in hand.

It is important to understand that making good choices that affect you personally has a profound impact on family relationships. It shapes the emotional climate of the home, influences how family members interact with each other, and sets the tone for long-term harmony and trust. When family members consistently make responsible, thoughtful choices such as being honest, keeping promises, and considering others' needs, it strengthens trust. Parents who keep their word teach children that reliability matters, and a child who tells the truth—even when it's hard—shows integrity that deepens mutual respect.

Making good decisions often involves self-control, patience, and empathy. Choosing to speak kindly instead of reacting in anger or choosing to listen rather than argue helps keep the family environment peaceful. When a spouse chooses to respond calmly in a disagreement, it diffuses tension and models healthy conflict resolution for the rest of the family.

Amit Ray, an Indian author, spiritual master, and pioneer of the Compassionate Artificial Intelligence movement, posits that effective decision-making can be seen as an optimal link between memory of the past, realities of the present, and predictions of the future. It is an excellent summary of the delicate nature of making decisions, as it encompasses the variables of logic and emotion, our beliefs from the past, and assumptions of the future. Bear in mind that both logic and emotions (or intuition) are important when making decisions. Logic seeks facts and often expert advice, and emotions seek preferences and consider past experiences.

The Word of God provides profound wisdom for making choices in our lives. Remember the advice of scripture, to rely on the guidance of God, when facing choices: **“Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will direct your paths.”** (Proverbs 3:5-6). May we abide in the commandments of Jesus when making decisions, seeking first the kingdom of God, and putting Him first in all things.

According to William Jennings Bryan, “You are a product of your decisions, not your conditions.” Translation: Your choices matter. So, choose wisely!






