Praise the Lord, and Happy Resurrection Sunday! Welcome back as we continue with our series: ***You Are Important!*** Part VI. As I pointed out last month, we all need the same goal, sacrifice, and zeal if we are going to fulfill our roles in God’s Army.

Listen! It would be a wonderful thing if pastors received more calls offering help than they get asking for help. It would do our hearts good to get calls inquiring about goals and objectives of the church and what can be done to accomplish them, rather than all the other foolishness we are constantly plagued with.

1 Peter 4:11 tells us this: **“That God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ.”** We need to glorify God in our services! A goal like this can transform even secular or mundane services into a sacred and important one! Whether you are in the kitchen or on the serving line. Whether you are repairing the church or cleaning it. Whether you are teaching or faithfully sitting and learning. Whether you are packing food or distributing it. Whether you are on the street witnessing or at the church praying for those who are out witnessing. You are important!

The bottom line is that we must glorify God in all that we do through Christ Jesus! Now we must ask, “What kind of sacrifice is required to get the job done? Whether you are working at the front or at the rear, what kind of sacrifice is required to accomplish the task? What are we willing to do to get the job done? You may as well fasten your seat belts. The word sacrifice alone scares people. They try to avoid it at all cost.

1 Peter 4:10 gives us this sacrifice: **“As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good**

stewards of the manifold grace of God.” Each person has a gift, an ability, given to him by God’s manifold grace. And whatever God has given us, we must be good stewards over it. Whatever it takes, we must guard it; we must develop it, and use it because our very lives depends on it!

Matthew 25:14-30 teaches us as stewards, we will one day give an account. We may not have the same gifts, or number of gifts, but we are expected to do the best with what we have! We are not to squander what has been given us! While we may serve in different capacities of ministry, we should be willing to give the same degree of sacrifice! Here are some things to consider:

1. We should be willing to sacrifice just as much as the pastor and the leaders sacrifice. And the leaders should be willing to sacrifice as much as the pastor sacrifices.
2. Should the soldiers in the rear be squandering what was given them to support the soldiers at the front? I don’t think so!
3. Should we not all have the same willingness to sacrifice if the need is there? Yes, we should!
4. If the brethren at the rear sacrificed as much as they expect those at the front to sacrifice, wouldn’t there be more good things being accomplished? I believe so!

Reshaped From Your Brokenness

Jeremiah 18:1-6 (NLT)

“The Lord gave another message to Jeremiah. He said, (2) Go down to the potter’s shop, and I will speak to you there. (3) So I did as he told me and found the potter working at his wheel. (4) But the jar he was making did not turn out as he had hoped, so he crushed it into a lump of clay again and started over. (5) Then the Lord gave me this message: (6) O Israel, can I not do to you as this potter has done to his clay? As the clay is in the potter’s hand, so are you in my hand.”

We have all experienced seasons of brokenness in our lives. There are moments when we feel shattered—like pieces scattered beyond repair. At times, it feels as though we are too far gone, too distant from God, too damaged to be made whole again. The weight of pain, disappointment, and failure can make us feel like we are suffocating under the pressure of it all. In those moments, questions begin to rise within us:

1. Who can put me back together?
2. Who can heal what has been broken inside of me?
3. Who can make me whole again?

Jeremiah paints a powerful picture for us. God sends him to the potter’s house—not to simply observe, but to understand a deeper spiritual truth. The potter was shaping clay on the wheel, but when the vessel became marred, he did not throw it away. Instead, he reshaped it. He started over. This is the beauty of our Heavenly Father.

The potter represents God. The clay represents us—fragile, imperfect, and often broken. Yet, even in our broken state, God does not discard us. He does not walk away from us. Instead, He lovingly gathers every broken piece and places us back on the wheel.

God sees what we cannot see. He sees beyond the cracks. He sees beyond the pain. He sees the purpose. Sometimes, the breaking is part of the process.

There are seasons when God allows us to be pressed, stretched, and even crushed—not to destroy us, but to reshape us. What feels like an ending is often God preparing us for a new beginning. The potter knows exactly how much pressure to apply, how much water is needed, and how to mold the clay into its intended form.

Just because you are broken does not mean you are beyond repair. You are still in the Potter’s hands.

When we surrender ourselves to God, He begins a divine transformation. He takes what was damaged and creates something beautiful. He turns our pain into purpose, our wounds into testimonies, and our brokenness into restoration. But there is one requirement: We must stay on the wheel; We must trust the process; We must trust the Potter; We must allow Him to do the work.

Your brokenness is not your end—it is the beginning of your testimony. One day, you will look back and say: “I was broken, but God reshaped me; I was hurting, but God healed me; I was lost, but God restored me.” And that testimony will not only glorify God, but it will also encourage someone else who feels like giving up.

Remember this truth: Broken pieces become beautiful pieces in the hands of the Lord. So today, surrender every broken place to God. Let Him mold you. Let Him reshape you. Let Him restore you. Because the Potter is not finished with you yet.

Marriage Matters – *Be Best Friends (Part 3)*

During this series on “Marriage Matters,” I will provide information designed to improve or restore your relationship. They will be usable and easy to implement. For this article, I suggest you “Be Best Friends.” “Happily ever after” is achievable for ordinary people who decide to love on purpose, honor their covenant, and practice the fundamentals of relationship building consistently. Will there be challenges and setbacks in your marriage? Of course. That is the very definition of life.

The term “bestie” is defined as a person’s best friend. It is commonly used in informal contexts to refer to someone with whom one shares a close and special bond. I have often noticed that close friends have better relationships than married couples. There are obviously many reasons for this phenomenon. One in particular is that best friends spend most of their time together, focusing on positive topics and things they have in common, such as music, sports, or hobbies.

Friendship is a fundamental pillar in marriage and makes a world of difference, which is why I always encourage married couples to be friends, not just spouses. And not just friends...best friends! Being best friends in marriage means your spouse is your confidant, adventure buddy, and safe harbor, built on deep understanding, shared laughter, and unwavering support.

A married couple who are best friends genuinely enjoy each other’s company. They share laughter, support each other, and show affection beyond romantic attraction. This emotional intimacy helps couples stay connected even when the initial passion fades or life gets difficult. Being besties builds trust, honesty, and loyalty; qualities that are essential in marriage. When you’re best friends with your spouse, you feel safe to be yourself, knowing they accept you fully.

Friends talk openly, listen without judgment, and try to understand each other’s perspectives. When couples communicate as friends, they’re more likely to resolve disagreements calmly and respectfully rather than through blame or anger. Friendship brings joy and playfulness into the relationship. Sharing hobbies, humor, and simple pleasures keeps the bond fresh and helps prevent routine or boredom from setting in. You become partners in both love and life’s adventures.

Best friends encourage each other’s growth and success. In marriage, this means being a cheerleader for each other emotionally, professionally, and spiritually, during good times and bad. This kind of partnership deepens respect and admiration. Being besties provides the emotional stability and support necessary to guide you through the challenges of life together.

Romantic love may bring two people together, but friendship keeps them together. Being “BESTIES” (best friends) helps married couples build a foundation of mutual respect, laughter, and unwavering support, which are the ingredients of a loving, fulfilling, lifelong relationship.
