Praise the Lord, and welcome back as we conclude our series: **You Are Important! Part VII**. And because you are important, you will put forth the same sacrifice and zeal for the mission, whether you are at the front or the rear.

If one sacrificed as much as others, wouldn't there be much more accomplished? If one is eating up all the food in the rear, what will the front line fellow have when he's in need? What kind of sacrifices are you willing to make for the Lord and His church? Are you willing to go the distant? Think on these things.

And now I must ask, what kind of zeal should we have?

Again, **1 Peter 4:11** provides us an answer: **“If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God; if any man minister, let him do it as of the ability which God giveth: that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.”**

Whatever our ability, whatever our service, God gives us the strength to do it! Shall we be slack with what God has given us? I think not! We should be zealous to utilize what we have in a manner that's worthy of God's precious gift! According to **Philippians 2:13**, **“It is God who works in us both to will and to do of His good pleasure.”** He totally equips us for the task!

It is not so much WHAT service we render to God, but HOW we do it. And the sacrifice and zeal that might be expected of one should be expected of all, for we seek the same goal! We serve the same God!

Finally, let's revisit the fact that both services receive the same

reward. We saw where David made this a law in Israel. He said that they shall share alike, whether they stayed by the supplies, or served in the battle. Whether they served at the rear or served at the front, they shall share alike!

This principle is also repeated in the New Testament. Jesus taught it in **Matthew 10:41-42**, **“He that receiveth a prophet in the name of a prophet shall receive a prophet's reward; and he that receiveth a righteous man in the name of a righteous man shall receive a righteous man's reward.”** Good God Almighty! God is not a respecter of persons!

In conclusion, I want to say this: Too often the Lord's work is hindered by a lack of support. Some may be willing to go and teach, but others may not be willing to send and or support them. Yet we have seen that both forms of services are equally important and requires the same goal, sacrifice, and zeal; and they are both rewarded!

My friend, wherever you may serve in the Lord's army, whether at the front or at the rear, do it as good stewards and with great zeal! **Colossians 3:23-24** declares, **“And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men; (24) Knowing that of the Lord ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ.”**

The bottom line is this: You are important and your labor will not be in vain! Serve faithfully and give God praise!

Have You Gone Back To Thank Jesus?

Luke 17:11–19 (*NLT*)

“As Jesus continued on toward Jerusalem, he reached the border between Galilee and Samaria. As he entered a village there, ten men with leprosy stood at a distance, crying out, “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!” He looked at them and said, “Go show yourselves to the priests.” And as they went, they were cleansed of their leprosy. One of them, when he saw that he was healed, came back to Jesus, shouting, “Praise God!” He fell to the ground at Jesus’ feet, thanking him for what he had done. This man was a Samaritan. Jesus asked, “Didn’t I heal ten men? Where are the other nine? Has no one returned to give glory to God except this foreigner?” And Jesus said to the man, “Stand up and go. Your faith has healed you.”

There once were ten lepers who lived outside of town because they were considered unclean according to cultural and religious laws. They were isolated, rejected, and forced to live at a distance from others. Their condition defined them in the eyes of society. Have you ever felt like that? Isolated. Distant. Defined by your past, your mistakes, or your struggles?

These ten men cried out to Jesus with desperation, **“Master, have mercy on us!”** And in His compassion, Jesus responded. He didn’t question their worth. He didn’t turn them away. He gave them an instruction—and as they obeyed, they were healed along the way.

All ten received a miracle.

All ten were cleansed.

But only one returned.

One leper, when he realized he had been healed, didn’t continue on with life as usual. He turned around. He went back. He lifted his voice in praise, fell at the feet of Jesus, and gave Him thanks. While the others were focused on the blessing, the one was focused on the Blessor. Jesus asked a piercing question: **“Where are the other nine?”** This question still echoes today.

Have you gone back to thank Jesus for:

- The doors He opened that no man could shut?
- The healing He brought to your body or your mind?
- The protection you didn’t even realize you needed?
- The prayers He answered—and even the ones He didn’t?

Jesus did not have to heal, deliver, or restore us, but He chose to. His grace is unearned, His mercy is undeserved, and His love is unfailing. Yet, how often do we receive the blessing and move on without returning in gratitude? The one who returned didn’t just say “thank you”—he worshiped. He humbled himself at the feet of Jesus. His gratitude turned into reverence. Gratitude is more than words—it is a posture of the heart.

When we intentionally return to Jesus daily with thanksgiving, we acknowledge:

1. That He is our source
2. That He is our sustainer
3. That every good and perfect gift comes from Him

Our worship becomes the evidence of our thankfulness.

All ten were healed physically, but the one who returned received something deeper.

Jesus said, “**Your faith has healed you.**” This speaks not only of physical healing, but of spiritual wholeness. Gratitude positioned him for something greater than the miracle—it positioned him for transformation.

Do not just accept the blessings from God and forget to return to Him.

- Return in the morning.
- Return in the evening.
- Return in the middle of your storm.
- Return when things are good—and when they are not.

Let your life declare: “Thank You, Jesus, for what You have done, what You are doing, and what You will do.” Today, take a moment and reflect:

1. What has Jesus done for you recently?
2. When was the last time you intentionally thanked Him?
3. Are you living like the nine—or like the one?

Make the decision today to be the one who goes back.

Marriage Matters *Communication Matters (Part 4)*

At the core of every healthy marriage is a couple's ability to communicate effectively with one another. Difficulties experienced in communication are because each person typically has a different background, experiences, and sometimes even culture, which all affect communication. Not to mention that men and women are quite different when it comes to communication. Adding to the challenge is the fact that 60% to 90% of all communication consists of body language, eye contact, facial expressions, and tone rather than words.

The word communication has its root in the Latin verb "communicare," which means 'to share' or 'to make common'. Communication is usually understood as the transmission of information: a message is conveyed from a sender to a receiver using some medium, such as sound, written signs, bodily movements, or electricity. Communication issues deal with 1) lack of communication, 2) poor communication, 3) ambiguous communication, and 4) inappropriate communication. It does not always involve talking.

Cursing, blaming, accusing, gossiping, lying, etc., are inappropriate forms of communication, especially in the context of marriage. Most fights could be avoided if couples spoke words that build up rather than tear down.

We have the power in our tongues to create or to destroy. We can encourage, uplift, or hurt people with our words. The saying, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me," is actually not true. Many people carry great hurt and pain from words spoken over them years ago. Someone told them they were ugly, skinny, fat, not smart enough, and negatively compared to their parents. That hurt, and the stigma can stay with them for years.

By contrast, people who have had encouraging family, friends, and communities typically are confident and hopeful. In fact, words spoken over people can and have affected their destiny. Even James, the brother of Jesus, taught that although the tongue is a small member of the body, it is unruly and full of poison (**James 3:5-10**).

The importance of communication cannot be overemphasized, as our words can develop a beautiful and prosperous marriage, or they can be a detriment to a couple's relationship. I have been appalled at the language and tone some couples use. I have heard people speak more kindly to their dogs...no kidding. Harmful and degrading communication should not come out of our mouths, but only that which builds others up according to their needs.

Psychologists have affirmed that a useful method to aid in communicating more productively is the use of "I" statements instead of "you" statements. For example, when a wife says, "You never listen to me!" and "You don't care about me!" it automatically makes a husband feel attacked and go on the defensive. Using "I" statements, the wife would say, "When you start talking before I finish sharing, I feel like you're not listening to me." "When you watch TV all night, I feel like you don't care about me." Using "I" statements is simply giving information, instead of accusing your spouse of doing something wrong.

Healthy couples place emphasis on communication and strive to do it well. Remember, "Sticks and stones can break your bones, but words can crush your soul." Stay tuned for more on communication next month.

“Heal me, O LORD, and I shall be healed; save me, and I shall be saved: for thou art my praise.” Jeremiah 17:14

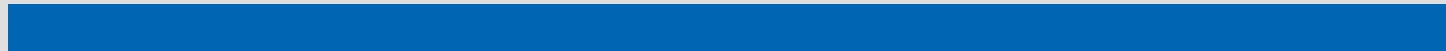
It is absolutely clear from this passage that we can ask God for healing. Not only will He heal us, but He will set us free and put a praise on our lips!
