Praise the Lord, and welcome back! We are dealing with the subject: *How To Hold Up Under Trials*. I mentioned last month that patience is more than just a passive virtue. When trials and tribulations come, we have to keep moving. We can't quit. We must be determined to get through the adversities of life! The Apostle Paul was a great example of pressing forward, despite hardships.

He declares in **2 Timothy 3:10-11**. "**But thou hast fully known my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, charity, patience, (11) Persecutions, afflictions, which came unto me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra; what persecutions I endured: but out of them all the Lord delivered me.**"

Listen! Perseverance is necessary for mature growth. **Romans 5:4** says, "**For the trying of your faith worketh patience, and patience experience** (so you won't be unfamiliar with the hardships), **and experience hope** (hope to hold on, hope to fight through it, hope to want to get through it). **And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.**" This was made possible by the death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! We have the victory!

Perseverance is necessary to endure trials and yet maintain our ways. Ways of sacrifices: Church attendance, Offerings, Tithes, Fellowship, Love for our neighbor, Prayer, Worship. And any other good thing we can find to do that will glorify our Father in heaven.

Perseverance helped Job to endure his trials. He declares in **Job**

13:15, "**Though he slay me, yet will I trust in him: I will maintain mine own ways before him.**" In other words, I'm going to continue doing what I was doing before these calamities came upon me! I will not quit! God is worthy of praise!

Perseverance is necessary for eternal life. We must be patient in doing good to receive eternal life. **Hebrews 10:36** tells us, "**We must have patience** (perseverance) **to receive the promise.**"

I want to share another point of interest, which is: Developing perseverance. Jesus was a model of perseverance all the way to the cross: He was lied on, scorned, given an unjust trial, spit on, whipped beyond recognition, hairs plucked from his face, nails driven through His flesh, pierced in His side, and then said Father forgive them, for they know not what they do. My God! My God!

Listen! Perseverance must be developed. And in order for this to happen, we must have the right fundamentals. Allow me to share the first one with you?

We must have the Word of God. **Romans 15:4** says that the Word provides patience and hope. Let's read it. "**For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope.**" Thank God for His Word! Silent Prayers Produce Answered Prayers

Scripture Focus: “Now Hannah spoke in her heart; only her lips moved, but her voice was not heard. Therefore Eli thought she was drunk.” 1 Samuel 1:13 (NKJV)

Have you ever prayed so deeply that no words could adequately express what was in your heart? There are moments in life when our burdens, disappointments, and desires become so overwhelming that our prayers are spoken more through tears than through words. Hannah’s story reminds us that God hears even our silent prayers.

Hannah was a woman who carried the pain of barrenness. Year after year she endured ridicule and heartache because she could not bear children. Yet instead of allowing bitterness to consume her, she carried her burden to the Lord.

The Bible tells us:

“And she was in bitterness of soul, and prayed to the Lord and wept in anguish.” 1 Samuel 1:10 (NKJV).

Hannah’s prayer was unique. She was not shouting or drawing attention to herself. In fact, her lips moved, but no sound came from her mouth.

“Now Hannah spoke in her heart; only her lips moved, but her voice was not heard. Therefore Eli thought she was drunk.” 1 Samuel 1:13 (NKJV).

What others misunderstood, God fully understood. While Eli saw silence, God heard every word. While others saw a broken woman, God saw a faithful daughter pouring out her soul before Him.

Hannah explained: **“For out of the abundance of my complaint and grief I have spoken until now.” 1 Samuel 1:16 (NKJV).**

After pouring out her heart to God, Hannah left with peace. Her circumstances had not yet changed, but her faith had been strengthened. She trusted God with the outcome.

The Lord answered Hannah’s prayer. In His perfect timing, she conceived and gave birth to a son named Samuel, whose name means “heard by God.”

“So it came to pass in the process of time that Hannah conceived and bore a son, and called his name Samuel, saying, ‘Because I have asked for him from the Lord.’ 1 Samuel 1:20 (NKJV).

Silent Prayers Produces Answered Prayers

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Hannah's story teaches us several important truths:

1. **God Hears Silent Prayers:** You may not always have the words to pray, but God hears the cries of your heart. Every tear, every sigh, and every silent plea reaches His throne.
2. **Prayer Changes Us Before It Changes Our Circumstances:** Hannah left the temple encouraged before she received her miracle. Prayer often brings peace before it brings provision.
3. **God's Timing Is Perfect:** Hannah's answer did not come immediately, but it came at the appointed time. Delays are not denials when God is involved.
4. **Faith Continues Trusting:** Even when nothing appears to be happening, faith believes that God is working behind the scenes.

Many believers are carrying silent prayers today—prayers for healing, restoration, employment, direction, salvation for loved ones, or breakthrough in difficult situations. Hannah's testimony reminds us that God specializes in hearing what others cannot hear and answering what seems impossible. Therefore, do not give up on your prayers. Continue bringing your requests before the Lord. The God who heard Hannah still hears His children today.

Prayer

Heavenly Father, thank You for hearing every prayer that rises from our hearts. Thank You that even when words fail us, You understand our deepest needs. Help us trust Your timing and remain faithful while we wait. Strengthen our faith and fill us with peace as we place our concerns in Your hands. Just as You answered Hannah, remind us that You are still working on our behalf. In Jesus' name, Amen.

What silent prayer have you been carrying before God? Today, surrender it to Him again and trust that He hears every word—even the ones that never leave your lips.

Pneumatology Part III

Greetings, everyone!

We recently studied “Pneumatology,” focusing on the Holy Spirit’s work, symbols, and titles. This month, we continue with the “Trinity.” What is the **Trinity**? Although the word does not appear in Scripture, it is used to describe the doctrine that the one God exists eternally as three distinct Persons. The term comes from the Greek Trias, first used by Theophilus (A.D. 168–183), or from the Latin Trinitas, first used by Tertullian (A.D. 220), to express this doctrine (Easton’s Bible Dictionary, 1897).



The illustration uses three distinct symbols to represent the three Persons of the Trinity: the Father is suggested by royal imagery, the Son by the cross, and the Holy Spirit by the dove and flame. The shared light and the connected circular design point to the unity of the one divine essence, while the separate symbols preserve the distinctions among the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Scripture teaches that there is only one God. Deuteronomy 6:4 (*NKJV*) says, “Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one!” This establishes biblical monotheism: Christians do not worship three gods, but one God.

The Father is called God. Jesus prays to the Father in John 17:3, calling Him “the only true God.” The Father is clearly identified as God throughout Scripture.

The Son is called God. John 1:1 says, “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.” John 1:14 explains that “the Word was made flesh,” referring to Jesus Christ. Thomas also confesses Jesus as “My Lord and my God” in John 20:28.

The Holy Spirit is called God. In Acts 5:3–4, Peter says that Ananias lied to the Holy Spirit, then says he lied “unto God.” This shows the Holy Spirit is not merely a force or influence, but divine.

The three are named together. Jesus commands baptism “in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost” in Matthew 28:19. Paul also blesses believers with “the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Ghost” in 2 Corinthians 13:14.

In summary, Scripture reveals the wonder of the **one** true God, who eternally exists as **Father, Son, and Holy Spirit**. As we grow in our understanding of the Trinity, may our hearts be drawn into deeper worship, greater trust, and a closer walk with God through the life-giving work of the Holy Spirit.

Reflection and Prayer: Lord, open our hearts to the beauty and mystery of who You are—one God in three Persons. Teach us to worship the Father with reverence, follow the Son with faith, and depend on the Holy Spirit for wisdom, strength, and daily renewal. May this study deepen our love for You and lead us to live in closer fellowship with You. In Jesus’ holy name, Amen.

Marriage Matters *Honor One Another (Part 6)*

In public settings, it is proper protocol to honor and appreciate those to whom honor is due. As born-again Christians, we are good at honoring and appreciating God, Pastors, Bishops, and other ecclesiastical leaders. We know the protocol and know who to call. In fact, we generally start our remarks off by saying, “Giving honor to God, His precious son Jesus Christ, ...” This is appropriate because it demonstrates that we understand communications protocol, shows our humility and respect for leaders, peers, and subordinates, and enhances our credibility.

Romans 13:7 says, “**Render therefore to all their dues: tribute to whom tribute is due; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honor to whom honor.**” I spent 26 years as an Army officer, and one thing they made sure we embraced was giving honor to whom honor was due by rendering salutes and participating in ceremonial events such as awards ceremonies and promotions. Therefore, I posit that showing and expressing honor and appreciation in every setting is appropriate. It helps to create a good atmosphere and makes the recipient of the honor feel appreciated.

This long-standing protocol of honoring someone should be routine among couples...that is, if you want to create a loving environment. Unfortunately, this behavior appears to be missing in many homes, thus leading to unhappy marriages. Many spouses are unhappy because they feel unappreciated. When spouses feel this way, their love tank is low, and they typically harden their hearts and go into a robotic mode. In other words, they just go through the motions out of obligation. If you are “in love” with your spouse, honoring him/her should be the norm, not the exception. Honoring someone can be done in two ways: 1) saying it and 2) doing it. However, bear in mind that if you tell someone you appreciate them, but do not show it, then you are just blowing hot air. Actions really do speak louder than words. Words set the atmosphere, and actions express the truth. Honoring your spouse says:

I love you! | I see you! | I appreciate you! | You matter to me!

When you honor your spouse, they feel valued and are more likely to stay physically and emotionally close. Showing appreciation is amazingly contagious. When one spouse expresses it, the other typically responds with kindness, fueling joy and a healthier relationship. Here are some examples of what honor and appreciation look like.

- “Honey, thank you for taking the time to make breakfast this morning.”
- “Wow, you look amazing.”
- “Ummm, you smell good.”
- “If I had to do it all over, I would happily marry you again.”
- “I made dinner reservations at our favorite restaurant.”

For those of you who did not grow up hearing these kinds of words exchanged between your parents, or who have been married for years and are unaccustomed to speaking in this manner, it can sound a bit corny. Nevertheless, I strongly encourage you to do it, and like anything else, it will become the norm and take your marriage to a higher level. Couples who regularly express honor and appreciation for each other report higher relationship satisfaction, elevated personal well-being, and greater security. Spouses feel good deep down in their souls. Bottom line – honoring each other and showing appreciation make marriage feel better.

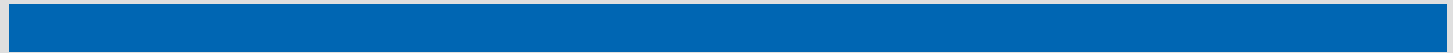
If you need anything that has to do with life and godliness, you will find it in His Word. It has already been given!
